[14] Alabama, was at Fort Stewart, Georgia, Fort Benning, Georgia, and Germany and with the Second Infantry [16] Division in Korea? All of you were exposed to Agent [17] Orange even though you might not have gone to Vietnam.

The American military and the American [18] [19] government has done a real good job of keeping secrets [20] of who was exposed to this disease. If you go to the [21] website for the VA, go to va.org, there's a section [22] there with Agent Orange. If you think that you were

[23] exposed, you can pull up -- there's a telephone number [24] where you can be tested.

What we're finding now is that many of the [25]

[1] got off of that airplane at Travis Air Force Base and

[2] saw all of those protesters lining each side of the

[3] street throwing rotten oranges and eggs and everything

[4] else and got into everything they threw at us. But,

[5] you know, it wasn't a fun time. But they're now

[6] starting to recognize that there was more effect of

[7] that war over there than people realized.

Also, if you have a veteran that you work [8]

[9] with -- and I've asked you to do this before -- if you

[10] think that they are in need of support, please

[11] recommend that they go to the VA support line or

[12] either anything to help them out because the suicide

[13] rate now is running at 22 percent for Vietnam

[14] veterans. And it's even higher for the sand war

[15] veterans, the Afghanistan and Iraq, Kuwait, and what
